INTRODUCTION

Your son is slow-witted; he is not to come to our school starting tomorrow!" Edison wept for a long time. Then he wrote the following lines in his memory book: "Edison was a completely dim-witted boy. But thanks to his mother's devoted service, he became a uniquely gifted individual."¹⁹ From this it is clear that the mother's knowledge in child-rearing revealed Edison's talent, which the whole world now recognizes. Moreover, "Many of the Prophet's (peace be upon him) wives were teachers of the rulings of Sharia, Qur'an-reciting qaris, transmitters of hadith, and jurists, renowned for their sharp abilities and rare intellect.

In particular, because our Mother Aisha had a thorough knowledge of mathematics regarding inheritance, even some prominent Companions would ask her for advice in dividing inheritances. Before the advent of Islam, people had no concept of fractions.

There was no jurist like our Mother Aisha who knew the rulings on inheritance so thoroughly and could apply them so expertly.²⁰ How wonderful it is that in Islam, women are commanded to acquire knowledge on the same scale as men. Since women's status and worth were considered immeasurable, the Companions did not hesitate to seek knowledge from our Mother Aisha. Thus, every woman's being educated has a profound impact on the lives of those who come after her as well as those around her.

3. Who else does women's education affect? Undoubtedly, every person who studies and researches to become a proficient specialist in a field gains their own place in society. When I overhear some men talking like that, I feel hatred: "Don't marry an educated girl; later she might use her independent thinking to oppose you and lecture you." What a perfect example of shortsightedness—they think like that, unaware that their children will be born with low intelligence and struggle to be independent.
