METHODS

1. Shadowing. For this method to be more interesting, we will need to divide the students into two groups and organize karaoke for them. The songs will be sung in English. Then, two students from each team are selected and they compete against each other. If a learner mispronounces a word or can't pronounce it at all, he or she is excluded from the game. I think, this method comes into play in the development of children's pronunciation. Another good thing about this method is that, the melodies or soundtracks they are playing are sung from native speakers, which is a great help to students to further improve their pronunciation skills.

2.Tongue twisters.

Thesis statements, considered a "language exercise", is another effective way to improve pronunciation. Let's take a look at a few tongue twisters now:

Peter Piper picked a peck of pickled peppers.

I scream, you scream, we all scream for ice cream.

Fuzzy Wuzzy was a bear, Fuzzy Wuzzy had no hair, Fuzzy Wuzzy wasn't very fuzzy was he.

The above thesis statements have not only helped several students improve their pronunciation, but have also been quite helpful to me.

3.Phonetic games.

In this game, students will have to record a transcription of the words that have been spoken. With the help of this game, students become more familiar with the reading of words.

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4.Interesting watching videos and cartoons.

At the same time, students will see interesting cartoons and movies along with subtitles, and once they see it, they will be able to pronounce the words without subtitles themselves. This method is much more fun and effective for students.

Taking everything into account, the purpose of this article is to explore pronunciation challenges faced by school-aged children during the process of learning a new language and to offer solutions by presenting engaging methods for children. It also aims to review modern techniques and practices that can assist educators in effectively improving pronunciation.
